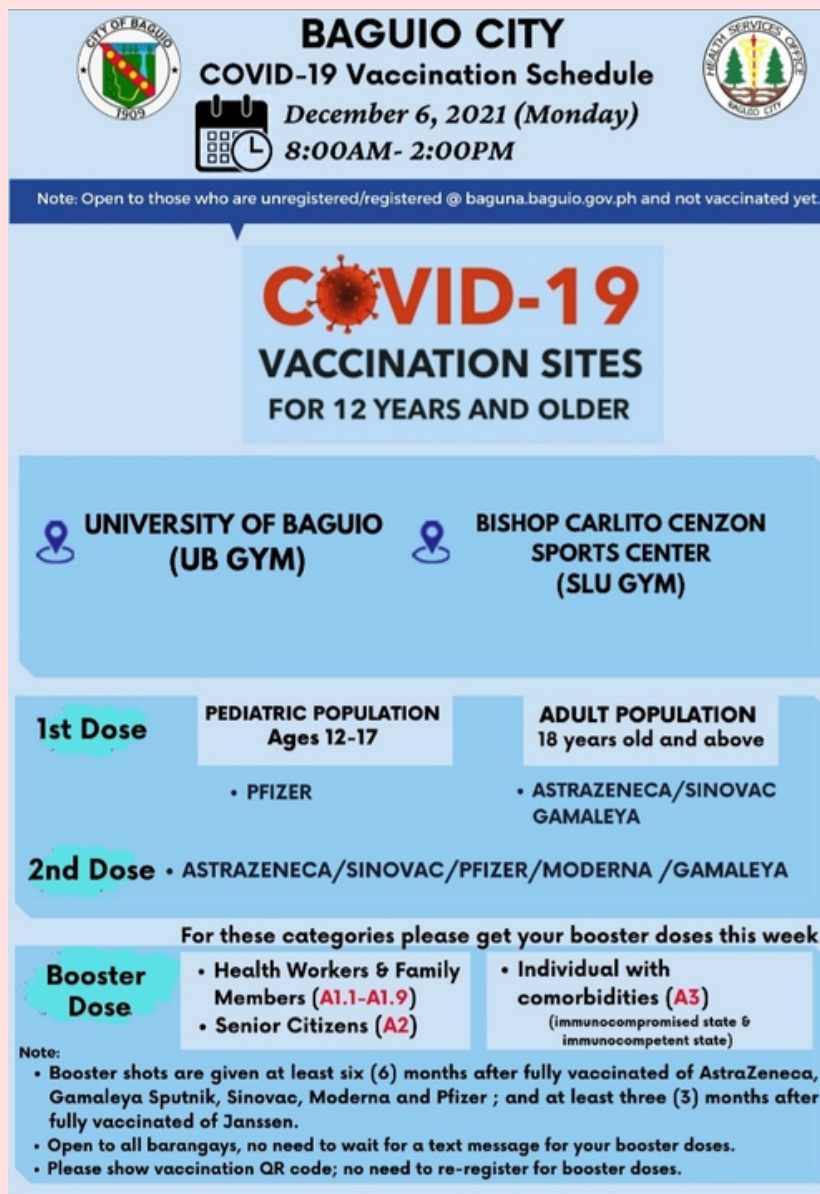

- Please show vaccination QR code; no need to re-register for booster doses.

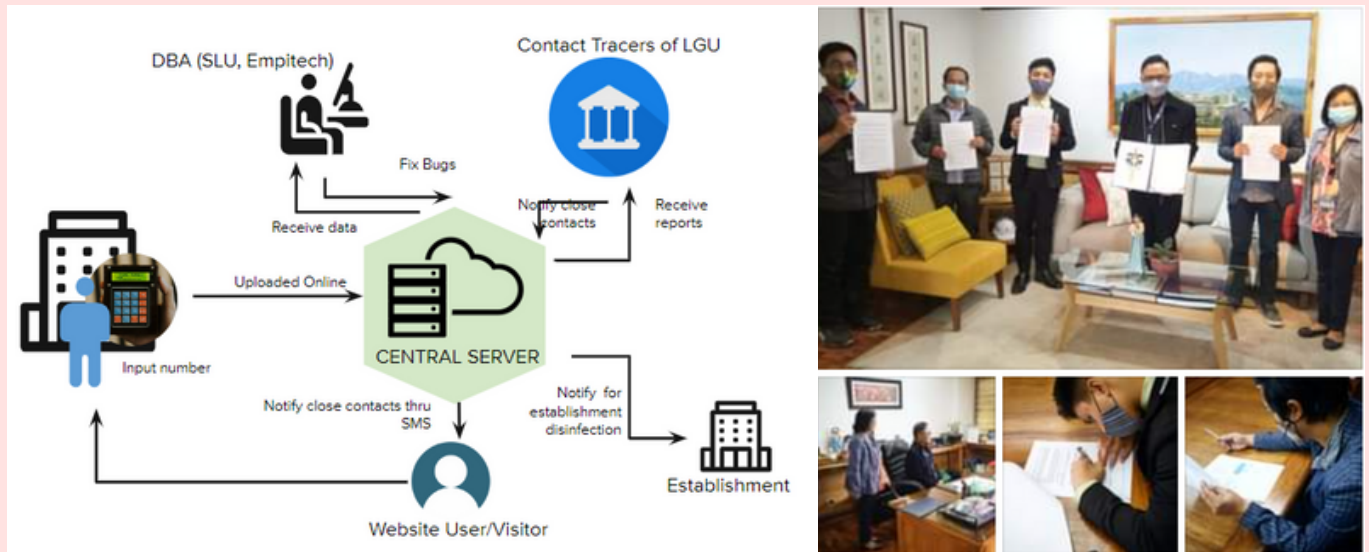

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ConTACTS: Contact Tracing Automated Collection and Tracking System

Traditional applications of the internet of things for COVID-19 contact tracing require a stable internet connection capable of real-time online communication. In the case of many locations in the Philippine setting however, connection to the internet is either unreliable or non-existent. In such areas, pen-and-paper contact tracing was the only option. The Saint Louis University (SLU) Project ConTACTS (Contact Tracing Using Automated Collection and Tracing System) addressed these gaps by creating a stand alone digital contact tracing device that can save contact tracing data offline and then upload it to a central database as soon as an internet connection was established.

The project was created with the consolidated knowledge, skills, and efforts of students, faculty, and administrative personnel of SLU. The project resulted in the creation of a system that was deployed in La Trinidad, Benguet, and selected areas in Baguio City, Philippines. Deployment was made possible with the support of the Local Government Units (LGUs), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), and various stakeholders. The system's overall success rate after deployment was 95.86%. Since contact tracing is no longer needed, the devices were pulled out for safekeeping. The institution, through research and innovation, is in the process of exploring the usability of the system in other fields.

Project ConTACTS highlights how an adaptation of the internet of things can be used by academic researchers as a solution to urgent problems in the community. The cooperation of various stakeholders resulting in the rapid deployment of the project demonstrates partnerships to attain UNDP sustainable development goals (SDGs), specifically SDG3: Good Health and Well-Being.

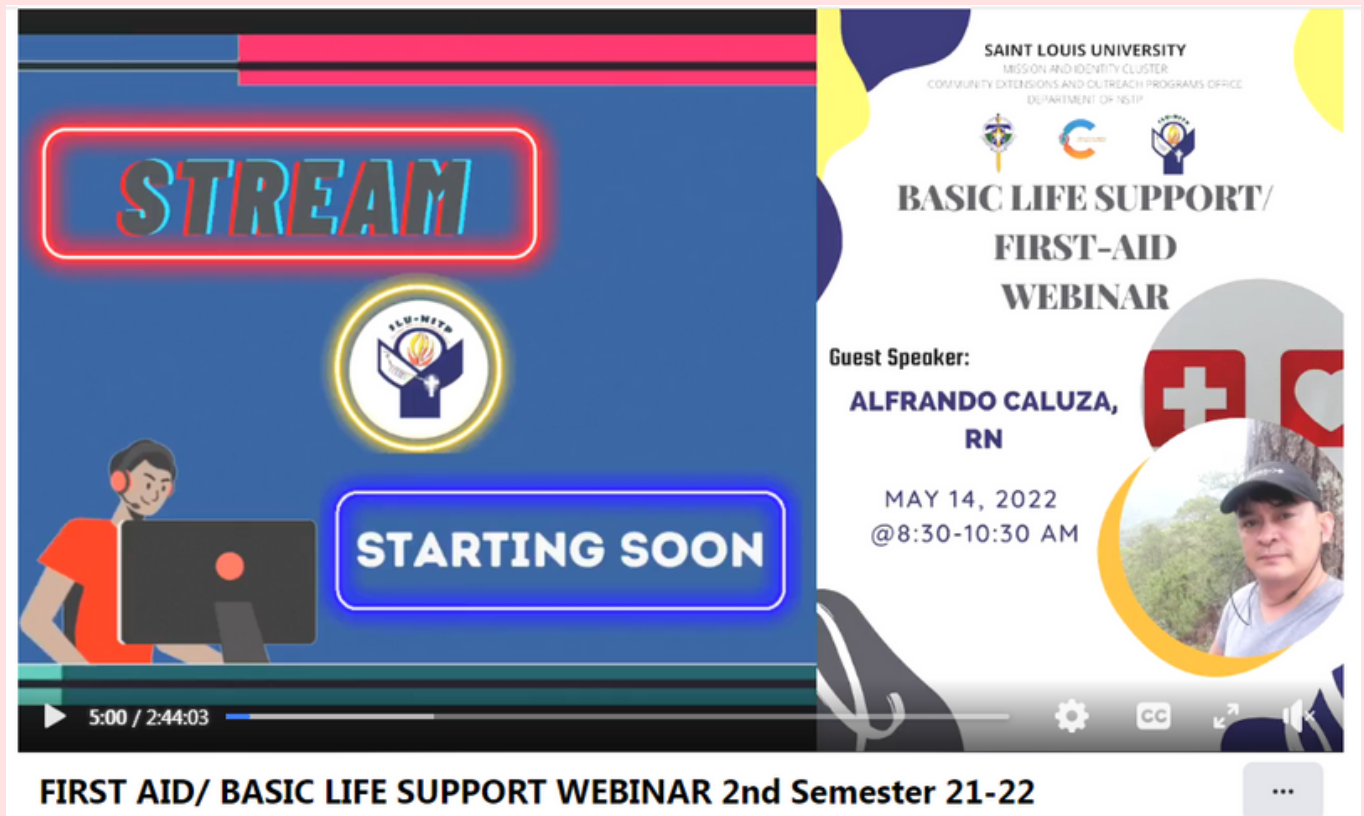
