The SLU Mural is located on the wall beside the staircase leading to the Msgr. Charles Vath Library Building, and is within the premises of the University Park. As such, it is one of the spaces that can be accessed by the general public whenever they enter the campus. The Mural was built by then SLU Campus Planner Architect Eduardo T. Mendoza in 1973. The Mural depicts the theme, "With knowledge, man has conquered sea and space", (Mendoza, 1973). The two students in the Mural represent the Cordillera people, while the torch represents the "Light of the North", and the book represents "Wisdom", which are the embodiment Saint Louis University's mission for Quality Catholic Education.
