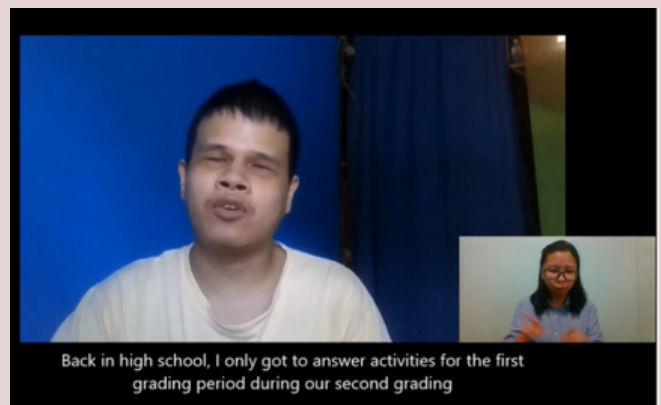

Saint Louis University, through the Inclusive Education Resource Center, formerly known as Institute for Inclusive Education (IIE), provides supplemental support to students with unique learning needs, especially to those with visual impairments. Students had been catered to through the provision of curriculum plus trainings, coaching, mentoring and tutorial lessons as well as the provision of learning aids and transcription of print texts to accessible formats in Braille, audio, and electronic copies. These learning materials are all produced by the University. Regular computer lessons are also provided to them both in virtual and face-to-face settings. Receiving teachers of these students are also supported through seminars, conferences, training-workshops, transcriptions of print teaching materials to accessible formats, and provision of universally-designed teaching aids. Recipients of this program are students from the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Region 1, 2 and 3.

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The Saint Louis University Library- American Corner Baguio provides free education access to the general public through the e-library USA, book collections, and local programs such as MOOC, Education USA, US Embassy Talks, Information and monthly thematic activities.
