Sign Language: Signal of inclusivity for the deaf community, a win-win situation of the able and the unable

To bridge the gap between the deaf and the able and to upthrust the public understanding of sign language, Psyche Society conducted a Sign Language Seminar, 5:30 PM to 8:00 PM at P700 Audio Visual Room, Perfecto Bldg. Saint Louis University (SLU), March 29.

The workshop was spearheaded by Ma'am Denise Pauline Sanchez- Osmeña. With the theme, "The Art of Signing: An Introduction to Communicating with the Hearing Impaired."

In beginning her talk, she reminded everybody of two main ground rules; there should be no judgment, only encouragement in learning sign language—there is no such perfect sign but only someone's creativity to express, and lastly to have fun.

Ms. Osmeña cleared some of the misconceptions and delivered facts about the deaf community. And shared some of the conducts in communicating by signs such as attention, show of interest, timing, flexibility, expression, and consideration.

"If you can't understand my silence, then how could you understand my words?" Ms. Osmeña stated.

This quote from her ultimately defines that, "a good speaker must be a good listener." It is not only the sound or words coming from our mouths that needs to be listened to by others, but the art of our silence.

She demonstrated some of the basics in sign language, on how to introduce identity, greetings and common phrases. The attendees also did their part as they introduced, greeted and conversed with their partner. As well as sang a song by doing the language that has been taught to them.

Ms. Osmeña told everyone that sign language is a skill. To hone the ability to do sign language is immersing and making it a habit to learn. It is a challenge to all of

Saint Louis University (SLU) welcomed faculty and administrators from Benguet State University, Kalinga State University, the University of Baguio, and the University of the Cordilleras who joined SLU faculty and administrators from SAMCIS, SEA, and SOHNABS at the Fr. Francis Gevers Hall in the SLU main campus on April 14, 2023, in the Seminar-Workshop on Academic Practice (SWAP). SWAP is designed to improve the quality of Philippine higher education delivery through efforts toward the wider dissemination and introduction of innovative future-proof academic practice to Philippine higher education teachers.

The SWAP was delivered by alumni of the University of Liverpool and AdvanceHE of the United Kingdom, who were supported by the Transformative Academic Practice in Higher Education in the Philippines (TAPHEP) project of the Commission on Higher Education to obtain their Post Graduate Certificate in Academic Practice and Fellowship into the Higher Education Academy. Maria Kristina Alinsunurin discussed three modules in the whole-day event from the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB), Ronald Candy Lasaten of Mariano Marcos State University (MMSU), and Jeffrey Des Binwag of SLU. They were supported by the project management team from UPLB, the lead implementing university for TAPHEP. Anna Floresca Firmalino, Director of the UPLB Office for International Linkages (OIL), led the project management team for the SLU leg of the SWAP, ably assisted by UPLB OIL staff Rovannea Banalo.

The Seminar-Workshop on Academic Practice (SWAP) has been hosted by eight higher education institutions for their faculty and of partner universities in their area. Two other HEIs are scheduled to deliver the SWAP in May to complete the delivery to the first cohort of Philippine HEIs under the TAPHEP program.

In furtherance of Mental Health Literacy, especially among community leaders and organizations in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) and given Saint Louis University's steadfast commitment to social involvement, Dr. Faridah Kristi C. Wetherick, the Dean of the School of Advanced Studies (SAS) and a Board Member of the Psychological Association of the Philippines (PAP) was invited to conduct a lecture on Mental Health and Psychological First Aid last November 25, 2022, at the Mountain Lodge in Baguio City. Participants were from the Local Government Units (LGUs) of Abra involved in ongoing rehabilitation efforts after the series of earthquakes that hit the province. Other participants were from NGOs in Baguio City.



SLU Hosts Solar Energy Harvesting Technology Seminar

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To further improve one's knowledge on solar energy harvesting technology, UCRD Researcher Engr. Joseph Allan Gamiao and RCEIAD Technology Development Asst. Lloyd Delaraga attended the regional seminar of the CHED Zonal Research Center for Region 1 and CAR Program Cluster Implementer (CHED-ZRC-PCI) held at Saint Louis University, Baguio City last June 10, 2010.


The seminar was focused on "Harvesting Energy from the Sun" which was expounded by Dr. Danilo B. Romero, a Professor in Physics and a DOST Balik Scientist. He informed the participants on the current issues and developments on solar energy worldwide particularly the latest development in the USA.

Gamiao and Delaraga learned ways on how to utilize solar energy: solar fuels (photosynthetic solar energy conversion to produce biomass and fossil fuels which currently supplies 90 TW globally to run the earth's biosphere; solar electric energy to produce chemical fuels such as H₂, O₂, CH₄); solar thermal (heating, solar thermal energy to electricity using thermoelectrics); and solar electricity (photovoltaics), a technology that uses semiconductors to convert light (solar) energy directly to electrical energy. The concern of the CHED ZRC Engineering Cluster Implementer and DOST is to invite engineers, and researchers from the region to propose a research study/project regarding solar harvesting technology specially the storage and distribution system.


