Saint Louis University is one of the partner organizations of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) that provides assistance to the City of Baguio in putting up the Smart Flood Early Warning, Information and Mitigation System project into action through the ASEAN Australia Smart Cities Trust Fund (AASCTF). The project used cutting-edge technologies to help the city with both planning for flood control and providing flood early warning and response services. The project produced three results: (i) a realtime data collection system was built in four river basins in City; (ii) flood mitigation action plan was created; and (iii) a smart flood early warning information system (FEWS) was established and operational.

Dr. Felina P. Espique, the SLU Vice President for Academic Affairs, participated in the signing of the law in her capacity as a Teacher Education Council Regular Member, Luzon Representative.

IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11713

"AN ACT FURTHER STRENGTHENING TEACHER EDUCATION IN THE PHILIPPINES BY ENHANCING THE TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL, ESTABLISHING A SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS IN THE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM, INSTITUTIONALIZING THE NATIONAL EDUCATORS ACADEMY OF THE PHILIPPINES, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7784, ENTITLED 'AN ACT TO STRENGTHEN TEACHER EDUCATION IN THE PHILIPPINES BY ESTABLISHING CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE, CREATING A TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL FOR THE PURPOSE, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES' "

The Department of Education (DepEd), Commission on Higher Education (CHED), Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), and Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), in consultation with other relevant stakeholders, hereby issue the following rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of the Act:

RULE I. PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

A milestone under the Promotion of Low Carbon Urban Transport Systems in the Philippines (LCT) Project, co-implemented by the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with the support of the Global Environment Facility, local government units, transport cooperatives, and universities pledged to carry on with the promotion and adoption of low carbon transport systems in their respective localities.

Since 2020, the LCT pilot cities of Baguio, Iloilo, Pasig and Sta. Rosa, along with General Santos City, have made significant accomplishments by paving the way to transition to electric vehicles (EV) for public transport, as well as promoting non-motorized means of transport such as cycling and walking. These efforts are expected to contribute to reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and improving air quality.

Secretary Bautista signed a MOA with each of the four pilot cities of Baguio, Iloilo, Pasig, and Sta. Rosa on continuing the implementation of low carbon transport programs, including an amended agreement signed with Dalan ni Taltallak consortium of Baguio City with Mayor Magalong. Key representatives from the academe, including Engr. Jeffrey Des Binwag, Dean of St. Louis University's School of Engineering and Architecture, Engr. Jeferd Saong, Dean of the University of Baguio's School of Engineering and Architecture, and Engr. Dexter Hansel Apnoyan, Dean of University of the Cordilleras' College of Engineering and Architecture, also participated in the ceremony.






SLU Collaborates with the Senate of the Philippines to take on the Positive Parenting of Children Act



SLU strengthens its Community Extension Program with NCIP-CAR and Partner Community in Domolpos

Through a coordination meeting on held on 22 September 2023, Saint Louis University (SLU) further strengthened its Community Extension Program with the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples-Cordillera Administrative Region (NCIP-CAR) and the partner community in Sitio Domolpos, Tinongdan, Itogon, Benguet. The willingness and capacity of the Iwak Tribe of Domolpos to embrace coffee tourism while preserving their cultural heritage is a significant undertaking requiring the consent of all parties involved. As such, to strengthen this partnership, NCIP Representatives presented details of the work and financial plan for certification processing, involving a series of steps to safeguard the Indigenous People's interests. This was followed by a meeting of minds in pursuit of the sustainable goals of the extension program on Coffee Tourism: A Community Development Project of Saint Louis University.

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SLU held the said coordination with Domolpos Ansipsip Ancestral Domain Indigenous Peoples Organization (DAADIPO) representatives, a few members of the twak Tribe, and NCIP Representatives through the Univide extension program of the School of Accountancy Management Computing and Information Studies (SAMCIS), School of Engineering and Architecture (SEA), and the National Service Training Program (NSTP) entitled "Benguet Coffee Project: A Coffee + Agrotourism+ Social Enterprise+ Community Development Project." The University was represented by the Extension Program Coordinator, Ms Eliza Joyce Palaroan; together with Ms Glory Dela Peña, Officer- in: Charge of SAMCIS; Ms Charmaine P.
