Saint Louis University (SLU) co-hosted the 11th Huachiew Chalermprakiet University (HCU) Conference in Thailand, marking a significant collaboration between the two institutions. The "Research to Serve Society" event invited SLU faculty members to present their research papers in Thailand. The conduct of these researches are ways of gathering and measuring data for the various SDGs. Example researches are: "Developing a GIS-Based Landslide Hazard Map for Kias, Baguio City, Philippines;" "The Effect of NursePlay in the Critical Thinking Disposition of Student Nurses;" "The Extent of Instructor Facilitation and Level of Satisfaction of Student Nurses on Self-Directed Learning;" and "The Mediating Effect of Motivation on Personality and Flow State." SLU's co-hosting the international conference not only highlighted the university's academic achievements but also strengthened its international collaborations and commitment to sustainable development. Such endeavor is aligned with SDG 4 (Quality Education) and 17 (Partnership for the Goals).

Saint Louis University researchers join forces with international researchers in advancing the SDGs:


SLU professors Geraldine S. Wakat, Freda B. Paulino and Sherene T. Cagaoan collaborated with Mark B. Ulla of Walailak University, Thailand in the conduct of a study on inclusive language instruction in the Philippines. Their investigation highlights the necessity of adapting teaching methods to cater to the diverse language backgrounds of primary students, an essential aspect of ensuring equitable education. This collaborative research supports the university's efforts in gathering data for SDG 4 to ensure quality Education. Evidently, the SDG 4 emphasizes the importance of ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education and promoting lifelong learning opportunities for everyone.

Meanwhile, SLU Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. Felina P. Espique has been working with other ASEAN researchers on a project organized by the Okayama University and Asia-Pacific Cultural Centre for UNESCO (ACCU). Specifically, the research project "Promoting Teacher Education for Climate Change Education through Collaboration between Asian Centres of Excellence on Education for Sustainable Development (ATECCE) aims to establish an "Asian Framework of Teacher Education Programme for Climate Change Education" alongside a dissemination guide, leveraging the expertise of Asian centers of excellence on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD). ESD, highlighted in Sustainable Development Goal 4.7, represents educational paradigm focused on promoting sustainability across dimensions of life and society.

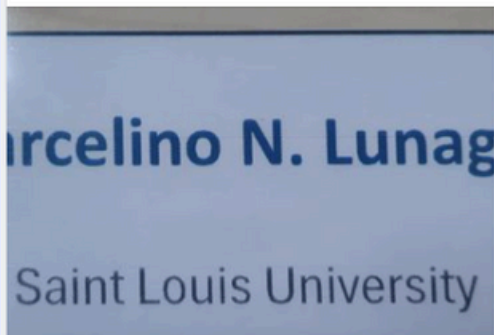
