Louisians Elect KASAMA / SSC Officers



This demonstrates transparent, accountable, and inclusive governance espoused by Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions (SDG 16).






SLU COMELEC Proclaims KASAMA/ SSC ExeCom Winners


SLU SSC Conducts Financial Literacy
