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
University Principles on Corruption and Bribery

Saint Louis University upholds a strong, institution-wide commitment to integrity and the prevention of corruption and bribery, as reflected in its handbooks for students, faculty, and administrative personnel.

The Student Handbook (Code of Discipline, Chapter 4) strictly prohibits bribery, corruption, undue influence, and dishonest transactions. Students may not offer or accept money, gifts, or favors for academic or administrative advantage, and the Code provides clear reporting and disciplinary procedures, reinforcing SLU's zero-tolerance stance.

The Administrative and Service Personnel Handbook requires employees to work "with honesty, sincerity, and integrity," prohibits the misuse of University property for personal gain, and mandates conduct consistent with good morals and public policy—establishing clear safeguards against corrupt behavior.

The Faculty Handbook defines professionalism through integrity, competence, and ethical responsibility. Faculty are expected to uphold all University policies and demonstrate fairness and accountability in teaching, research, and evaluation, ensuring conduct that is incompatible with bribery or any corrupt practice.

Together, these handbooks form a unified ethical framework that promotes honesty, transparency, and responsible citizenship across the University community, ensuring that all members uphold the highest standards of ethical behavior.
