The School of Law's CJ Manuel V. Moran Community Legal Assistance Office (CJMM CLAO) and the Law Student Practitioners (LSPs) conducted free legal aid at Malcolm Square, Baguio City, on 1 December 2023, with the assistance and supervision of the faculty and supervising lawyers. This is part of the celebration of the 112th foundation anniversary of Saint Louis University. At least sixty (60) clients were assisted by the LSPs and lawyers who participated in the event.

Aligned with United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) No. 16 on Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions, a comprehensive Data Privacy Awareness Training was held on 18 October 2025 at Holy Spirit Academy in Bangued, Abra, for principals and registrars of the Diocesan Schools of Abra. The training aimed to promote responsible data stewardship and institutional accountability in the digital era.

Conducted by Cecilia Mercado, PhD, the Data Protection Officer of SLU, the training equipped the participants with practical knowledge and compliance strategies under the Data Privacy Act of 2012 (Republic Act No. 10173). It emphasized transparency, legitimate purpose, and proportionality as guiding principles in handling student, personnel, and institutional data.
