## ANIDO 2025: SLU AS A SAFE, NON-PARTISAN SPACE FOR ELECTORAL DISCOURSE




On 6 April 2025, Saint Louis University hosted ANIDO: The 2025 Philippine Senatorial Forum — a neutral, non-partisan platform that brought together 20 senatorial aspirants, youth voters, and civic organizations. The forum, held at SLU's Center for Culture and the Arts Theater, was co-organized with the university's student government and a local civic group, creating a safe space for open and respectful discourse ahead of the national elections.

Participants engaged in moderated panel discussions, interactive Q&A sessions, and platform presentations where candidates addressed core national issues such as sustainable development, economic resilience, education, youth empowerment, and inclusive governance. This structured dialogue allowed voters — particularly youth — to hear diverse political perspectives directly and make informed decisions.

As part of the program, candidates signed an Integrity Pledge and Peace Covenant — a symbolic commitment to honest, transparent, and peaceful elections. This underscored the forum's values of accountability, unity, and civic responsibility, reinforcing democratic practices within the community.

By hosting ANIDO, SLU demonstrated its role as a neutral facilitator of democratic dialogue and civic education. The event empowered students and community stakeholders to engage meaningfully in national processes, thus aligning with SDG-related goals on peace, justice, and inclusive institutions. It provided a trusted space where differing political voices could be heard, contested respectfully, and understood — fulfilling the indicator's requirement for a university to offer a safe, neutral platform for public discussion.





#### SLU HOSTS ACUP YOUTH GATHERING FEATURING RENOWNED EXPERTS, FOSTERING CIVIC DIALOGUE AND ENGAGEMENT



In July 2024, Saint Louis University welcomed the first youth gathering organized by the Association of Catholic Universities of the Philippines (ACUP). The event featured prominent experts — among them, an esteemed national public figure — who engaged with students and youth participants in open, non-partisan discussions about national issues, civic responsibility, and social justice. The forum served as a neutral platform where diverse perspectives were shared respectfully, and participants were encouraged to reflect on governance, community welfare, and democratic participation. By providing this safe space for intergenerational and civic dialogue, SLU demonstrated its commitment to nurturing informed citizenship and fostering inclusive conversations on societal challenges — fulfilling the role expected of universities to facilitate open, democratic discourse.
