Anchored in its mission as a Catholic institution, Saint Louis University (SLU) conducted an orientation in preparation for its Three-Year Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Plan for Academic Years 2025-2028. The meeting, held on 07 July 2025, gathered the SLU heads of offices at the Fr. Francis Gevers Hall, Diego Silang Building, SLU Main Campus.

The SDG plan, rooted in the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (CICM) Advocacies and the mandates of the Catholic Church, seeks to equip the SLU community for works of service that embody compassion and Christian spirit.

The SDG plans, which will be submitted by 22 July and officially presented in the upcoming suppliers' meeting on 28 July, aim to target specific SDG key performance indicators (KPIs) aligned with the university's core values and the expertise of the offices.

The three-year SDG plan orientation marked a significant step for SLU in translating its beautiful mission into concrete actions that embody faith, service, and sustainable development.

Saint Louis University (SLU) hosted the City Government of Baguio's "Bingo Scorecard Eskwela Caravan and Stakeholder Consultation" at the Fr. Joseph Van den Daelen, CICM- Center for Culture and the Arts (CCA) Theater on 06 November 2024.

Through the SLU University Research and Innovation Center (UNRIC) and Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS), various high school and college organizations across Baguio participated in the multi-sectoral city-led project. Among five caravans, the University was the second to be selected as part of the initiative. Spearheaded by various city government offices in partnership with the non-governmental organization (NGO) Zero Waste Baguio, the Bingo Scorecard Eskwela Caravan encourages barangays and educational institutions to help build a sustainable and resilient Baguio. This project emphasizes vital areas such as environmental protection, livability, and disaster risk reduction, which are central to the city's plan to counter urban decay. The City Environment and Parks Management Office (CEPMO) spearheads the initiative, bringing together community resources and expertise to address pressing environmental issues the city is experiencing and commits to essential goals for Baguio's sustainable development.
