Achievement and Ecological Preservation [NAYAN]

NAYAN is a Kankanaey Ilocano meaning to stop, prevent, or restrain a person from doing something bad to others and to nature. It is defined as the only command given by Kabunian (God) to the Igorots to have a peaceful and progressive life. It is a principle of not doing bad acts towards others (and to nature); a principle that breeds all values like respect, love, and peace. Inayan principle says that when everyone is in harmony with man and nature, Kabunian (God) will bring blessings to their life. It is for these reasons, that Igorots practice this principle to enjoy a peaceful life (Sewry, 2016).
